

Descendants of Nancy Catherine Williams

Generation No. 1

1. NANCY CATHERINE³ WILLIAMS (*JOHN FINLEY*², *JAMES* ?¹) was born 29 November 1831 in Hardin County, Kentucky, and died 14 October 1876 in Maydelle, Cherokee Co., Texas. She married SILAS MOSES CRUME 06 February 1853 in Meade County, Kentucky, son of WILLIAM CRUME and MARY HOSKINSON. He was born 14 December 1825 in Hardin County, Kentucky, and died 23 March 1912 in Maydelle, Cherokee Co., Texas.

Notes for NANCY CATHERINE WILLIAMS:

Jess Scott has Nancy's death date as 14 November 1876 (instead of October, which is shown on her gravestone).

Notes for SILAS MOSES CRUME:

In the 1850 census for Meade County, Kentucky, Silas was listed as living with the William Marks family. (William was the son of Anne Barrett Crume Marks.) There, he worked as an overseer on the farm of John Finley Williams and thus met the daughter, Nancy. Soon after their marriage in 1853, they moved to Cherokee County in east Texas and settled on a large tract of land on Tales Creek. Silas operated a saw-mill, cotton gin, grist-mill, general store, and post office at different times.

Silas, Nancy, and daughter Susan (who lived only five years) were buried in the Pleasant Grove cemetery near Maydelle, Texas, under some iron ore crypts (actually open walls) which are the only structures of that nature in the cemetery. A son, Thomas Anthony, who also died young (20 years) is buried nearby with a conventional gravestone, as is a daughter, Sallie, who also died young (but had married a Tankersley). Son S. A. (Gus), his two wives, and two children who died in infancy (an unnamed son, and daughter Jewel Luther) are buried nearby. Six members of son John William's family are also buried in "Crume row", but he does not seem to be present--- perhaps buried in New Mexico, where he died.

Marriage Notes for NANCY WILLIAMS and SILAS CRUME:

The wedding was at the residence of Nancy's father in Meade County, Kentucky.

Thomas did not marry. Gladys Crume/McAdams had his death date as 9 November or 9 April of 1879 and Rick Crume has it as 9 April 1879, but his headstone in the Pleasant Grove cemetery at Maydelle, Texas, has it as 9 November 1875.

2. SAMUEL AUGUSTUS⁴ CRUME (*NANCY CATHERINE³ WILLIAMS, JOHN FINLEY², JAMES ?¹*) was born 21 August 1864 in Java, Cherokee County, Texas, and died 05 April 1944 in Maydelle, Cherokee Co., Texas. He married (1) LIZZIEBETH BELL CRAWFORD 16 January 1890 in Gent, ? County, Texas. She was born 11 December 1871 in ?, and died 05 March 1895 in ?. He married (2) LANORA BELLE FERGUSON 19 November 1903 in Anderson Co., Texas, daughter of JOHN FERGUSON and MARGARET JORDAN. She was born 20 February 1877 in Alder Branch, Anderson County, Texas, and died 29 January 1954 in Temple, Bell County, Texas.

Notes for SAMUEL AUGUSTUS CRUME:

Samuel ("Gus") and Lizziebeth's marriage certificate (made out by Rev. Perry Holyman!) indicates they were both living in Gent, Texas, at the time of their marriage at the same location. The wedding was held "at the residence of the bride's father", and in the "presence of the bride's family and large host of friends".

Gus was a farmer until he retired, and helped found the town of Maydelle, Cherokee County, Texas.

A short obituary for Gus indicates that funeral rites were held at the Pleasant Grove church near Maydelle by Rev. O. P. Meador, with burial in the Pleasant Grove cemetery. "Crume, 80, died last Wednesday morning at his Maydelle home. Surviving are his widow; four sons, Clyde Crume of Bakersfield, Calif.; Morris Crume of Huntington, Calif.; Arthur and Elmer Crume of Houston; two daughters, Mrs. Charles Leaverton of Bakersfield, Calif., and Mrs. H. M. Adams of Midland." (The latter, of course, really was Gladys--wife of Harry McAdams.)

A gushing tribute to Samuel and his service to the Maydelle First Baptist Church was entered into the 26 Nov 1944 conference minutes (Baptist Church?) by John T. Watson and T. E. Acker.

Grandson Samuel Elvis Crume indicated that he remembered his grandfather as being very strict, and that he had lived with them for a time in Munday, Texas (midway between Wichita Falls and Abilene, Texas)

Gus, his two wives, and two infant children (unnamed son and daughter Jewel Luther) are buried in "Crume row" of the Pleasant Grove cemetery near Maydelle, Texas.

In 1930, Gus and family were living in Haskell County, Texas on the farm near Munday. At that time Gladys 19, Floyce 15, and Clyde 10 were living at home.

Notes for LIZZIEBETH BELL CRAWFORD:

According to the marriage certificate, Lizziebeth was married in her father's residence at Gent, Texas, by the Rev Perry Holyman. The date of death is from a transcription from the S. A. Crume family bible, although Gladys Crume/McAdams entered it as 30 Sep 1895 in her "Genealogical Record" and on at least one other account,

Rick Crume has the first name as just "Lizzie".

Notes for LANORA BELLE FERGUSON:

Lanora ("Nora") was a teacher. Gladys Crume/McAdams reports the marriage to have occurred in Anderson County although there is also some indication that it may have been Cherokee County.

Nora is buried with her husband in the Pleasant Grove cemetery at Maydelle, Texas.

Grandson Sam E. Crume remembered his grandmother as "always helping someone else, and never asking anything for herself".

Notes for LURA GLADYS CRUME:

Gladys was a school teacher. She also gathered and organized a great deal of the Crume, and some of the McAdams, genealogy.

Notes for HARRY MAYHEW MCADAMS:

Harry was first a teacher, then bombardier in the U.S. Air Force in World War II, later achieving the rank of Lt. Colonel in the Air Force Reserves. Later, he was the manager of KWEW radio and then a State Senator of Hobbs, Lea County, New Mexico.

Notes for JAMES ARTHUR CRUME:

According to his father's obituary, James ("Arthur") was living at Houston at that time (April, 1944). He and Beatrice had no children of their own, but Arthur helped raise two step-children. He was an oil-driller for Creole Petroleum Company. Mrs. Laura Broughton indicates that he is buried in Forest Park Cemetery in Houston, Texas.

Notes for BEATRICE MOORE BAYLEY:

In her account "Descendants of William 'King' David Ferguson, Mrs. Laura Broughton indicates that Beatrice had two children by a previous marriage, but does not identify them or the previous husband.

Notes for SAMUEL MORRIS CRUME:

According to his father's obituary, Samuel ("Morris") was living at Huntington, California, at that time (April, 1944). He also operated a cafe in Haskell, Haskell County, Texas.

Son Sam E. Crume indicates that his parents were farmers until 1932, when they went into the restaurant business in Munday, Texas. They also operated restaurants in Seymour, Texas, and Altus, Oklahoma. They and their son moved to the Los Angeles area in 1943, where both parents worked in defense plants. They later moved back to Haskell, where they operated a steak house restaurant until their retirement to the Rice Springs rest home in Haskell, where they died.

Morris and Onah are buried in the Willow cemetery in Haskell, Texas.

Notes for CLYDE MARTIN CRUME:

Clyde drowned in the Kern river at Bakersfield, California. Although there was some discussion about bringing his body back to Maydelle, he was buried in Bakersfield.

3. JOHN WILLIAM⁴ CRUME (*NANCY CATHERINE³ WILLIAMS, JOHN FINLEY², JAMES ?¹*) was born 25 December 1853 in Cherokee County, Texas, and died 26 February 1912 in Grady, Curry County, New Mexico. He married SARAH E. SHERMAN 26 November 1874 in Cherokee County, Texas. She was born 01 September 1856 in ?, and died 06 April 1905 in Maydelle, Cherokee Co., Texas.

Notes for JOHN WILLIAM CRUME:

John's wife, Sarah, and five of their children who died young (Selwyn, Nannie, Fannie, Dora, and Silas) are buried in "Crume row" of Pleasant Grove cemetery near Maydelle, Texas. John doesn't seem to be, and was quite likely buried near his death site in New Mexico.

Notes for SARAH E. SHERMAN:

Sarah may have died elsewhere, but is buried in Maydelle, Texas, in Pleasant Grove cemetery, along with five of her children who died young.

Notes for DORA ? CRUME:

Notes for SELWYN ERNEST CRUME:

Selwyn live only about three days. He is buried in the Pleasant Grove cemetery in Maydelle, Texas, along with his mother and four other siblings who also died young.

4. MARY ELIZABETH⁴ CRUME (*NANCY CATHERINE³ WILLIAMS, JOHN FINLEY², JAMES ?¹*) was born 09 November 1857 in Cherokee County, Texas, and died 08 September 1928 in Waco, McLennan County, Texas. She married ALEXANDER ("ALEC") A. ACKER 07 January 1877 in Cherokee County, Texas. He was born Unknown in ?, and died 07 September 1931 in Waco, McLennan County, Texas.

Notes for MARY ELIZABETH CRUME:

As can be seen from the birth dates, Mary Elizabeth and Susan Cole were twins.

5. JAMES RICHARD⁴ CRUME (*NANCY CATHERINE³ WILLIAMS, JOHN FINLEY², JAMES ?¹*) was born 05 November 1859 in Cherokee County, Texas, and died 27 August 1925 in Cherokee County(?), Texas. He married MOLLIE ELIZABETH STEWART 30 January 1895 in Cherokee County, Texas. She was born 16 June 1873 in ?, and died 05 March 1955 in Los Angeles, California.

Notes for JAMES RICHARD CRUME:

James, and three children who died young (James R. Jr., Esther, and William W.) are buried in the Pleasant Grove cemetery in Maydelle, Texas; Mollie is not.

Notes for MOLLIE ELIZABETH STEWART:

Mollie is the sister of William Merrell ("Murt") Stewart, who married Ida Crume. It is reported that after husband "Jim" died, Mollie took the remaining family to California. She was buried in Los Angeles County, California (not with her husband).

Notes for WILLIAM W. CRUME:

William died in action in World War I while serving with "I-90 Division, Company M, 359th Infantry". He is buried with his father and two siblings in the Pleasant Grove cemetery at Maydelle, Texas.

6. ADA BELLE⁴ CRUME (*NANCY CATHERINE³ WILLIAMS, JOHN FINLEY², JAMES ?¹*) was born 28 August 1861 in Cherokee County, Texas, and died 22 January 1931 in Houston County(?), Texas. She

married REV. JOHN THOMAS FERGUSON Abt. 1902 in ?, son of WILLIAM FERGUSON and MARY MORTON. He was born 05 March 1844 in Alabama, and died 14 April 1916 in Houston County, Texas.

Notes for ADA BELLE CRUME:

"Belle" and her husband lived on a farm near Palestine, Anderson County, Texas. She is buried next to her husband, John Thomas Ferguson, in Evergreen cemetery at Percilla, Houston County, Texas. "Belle" and her husband lived of a farm near Palestine, Anderson County, Texas.

Notes for REV. JOHN THOMAS FERGUSON:

A 22-page listing of the descendants o William "King" David Ferguson (John Thomas' father) compiled by Mrs. Laura C. Broughton of Palestine, Texas, and dated January, 1960, has some comments about John Thomas: "A Baptist minister and Confederate veteran. He preached and farmed until the day of his death. Died suddenly; buried by (beside?) wives; Evergreen cemetery."

John ("Elder J.T.") is indeed buried in Evergreen cemetery north of Percilla (Houston County), Texas, with his two wives. His wife's father, W.H. Jordan, his nephew, Henry J. Ferguson, and his grandson, Julius Alton Ferguson, are also buried here--- along with a couple of later Fergusons (Mae D., 1919-1981, and Jack R., 1953-1974), and some Bishops (two of whom were married to Fergusons).

John, wife Margaret, and four of their children (John, Floyd, Lanora, and James), are shown in 1880 census to be living at Granbury, Hood County, Texas.

Child of SARAH CRUME and SEBORN TANKERSLEY is:
